

# The Journals of Bob Drifter by MLS Weech

This book is a very good read from a promising author, M.L.S. Weech. The main character, Bob, is a journeyman; it is his job to help people who are dying to cross safely over to the other side. There is just an awful lot to like about Bob. He is a well-conceived, fully fleshed out character that you can't help but admire and root for. He may not fully understand what his true purpose is, but still he navigates through his life, and through the lives of others he is bound to help, with a strong code of ethics, and a deep yearning to help others.

There is also a strong cast of compelling characters in this book, not the least of which is the big bad, Grimm. While I wouldn't classify this book as a horror novel, Grimm could easily come straight off the pages of one. It got to the point where I was so creeped out by Grimm and his cronies, I found myself concerned about the dark shadows lurking in my own home, trying to stay well away from any potential gathering of dark souls.


I am rating this book a 4. The book had a somewhat slow start and it took until about a third of the way in before it found its stride. Once it did though, it really had me spellbound and remained a page turner almost all the way to the end. The ending of the book could have been stronger and provided clearer answers to some of the book's bigger questions. I also felt that the journal entries that are peppered throughout the book should have let us into Bob's thoughts and feelings more. These all the reasons the book didn't get a 5 from me, but I would still highly encourage people to read about Bob in this very original story exploring and expounding on themes of light versus darkness, and good versus evil. He has a lot to say about personal accountability, and standing up for what you believe in, even when it's very, very hard.


Its wonderful to see what we might be doing in out old age. The thought of still kicking ass and showing the kids how it's done would be hilariously funny. Well done Ashley.

# The Clay Remembers by Sharon Miller


Sharon Miller's expertise in the history, archaeology, and geology of the area around Tucson, Arizona really shines in this beautiful story. The main character, Anna Robinson is a woman trying to build a new life, while at the same time unearthing her special gift for discovering the past.

I met the author, Sharon Miller, at the Tucson Festival of Books. What struck me most about her was the very intimate connection she had to this story. She described her own experience of placing her hands on an ancient Hohokam pot and feeling her own thumb connect with the imprint of the pot maker's thumb. She also described what it felt like to have the clay speak to her, much as it did to Anna in the book, telling her exactly how the puzzling pieces of the pot should come together in the restoration process. Because Sharon understood how the clay might speak to those able to listen, she was able to portray Anna's dramatic connections to the ancient artifacts with a striking deftness. These passages were, without a doubt, my favorite ones in the book.



I would recommend this book to anyone who loves stories with a Southwest setting. Just be prepared that another major plot line in this story centers on Anna's very dark and troubled marriage. Anna unearths the strength to stand up for herself in much the same way she uncovers the past buried in the desert dirt; carefully, bit by bit, until eventually something beautiful is revealed.

# Earth No 105 by Ame Terra

The words profound and exciting hardly ever go together, but Author Ame Terra's "Earth No. 105" fits that profile like a star-spangled glove. Brilliantly orchestrated and expertly contrived, this heart-stopping, pulse-pounding Sci-Fi action adventure about two teens trying to survive an apocalypse through the use of special powers that they only just acquired less than 24 hours before being swept up in a grave cataclysm, can't help but make a reader think about how they would feel being in their place. "Earth No. 105 is an earth-shattering adventure that will give anyone willing to consider that there are forces underway that will result in the eventual demise of our society the "Wilies".


This must-read novel is for anyone looking for a realistic ride through Armegeddon. Political power plays, pandemics, and all out wars give "Earth No. 105" a ring of truth—alluding to the possible means by which our own planet may fare through the End Times. The author does not "Wow!" us by having her characters demonstrate superhuman-like powers to save their world—although they are prodded by a higher power to follow a seemingly predestined plan, but the beauty of this tale is that it points out a realistic outlook of what our own future might be like, hinting that it is love, above all, that will save us.

# **Enchantments – The Beginning by Claire Plaisted**

I love a good magic-based fantasy book, but I'm pretty picky about which ones I read for pleasure and for the blog. Claire's magazine, The Indie Publishing News, always features KSR reviews, so of course I accepted a copy, pleased to see myself in the acknowledgements! Thank you for that, Claire.

It should be noted first that Enchantments is a novella, clocking in at only 91 pages, and therein lies the issue I had with the story. There just wasn't enough detail (hence the four star review instead of a five star). I found it all moved far too fast, everyone was too easily accepting, especially Farron, who finds out she's a Bu'lith and then seems to easily accept it and go off into another realm.

Why am I still giving the book five stars? Because the plot was brilliant! I immediately wanted to know more about The Shadow Realm and those who reside there, fighting the Shadow King.

# Great psychological crime thriller

This book has absolutely everything I look for in a crime thriller. Is there a ton of action? No. Is the editing in this book perfect? No. Did I care? No. I read a book hoping for great characters, and the two main men in this book are so well-portrayed that it was impossible for me not to get sucked in.

I felt on every page that the author knew exactly what he wanted to do. This genre works perfectly for getting into the minds of your antagonist and protagonist, and I loved the back-and-forth approach. These are very different men in terms of the morality spectrum, but there are also similarities that make things really interesting. I wondered at first if it would be confusing to jump from one guy's mind to the other's, but with each break I immediately knew whose head I was in – that's how clearly this author knows his characters. (As an avid reader, I can safely say this isn't always the case.)

I also wondered how it was going to work that the biggest/worst murder happens right away, never really building to a climax of action, per se. But this works because the story is about a cat-and-mouse chase, and Charles Street's breakdown from the start makes the tension really complex. Jack's journey is, in a way, even more complicated as he avoids getting caught. I can't say I was ever really cheering for him, but you do understand him.

I did find some bits a little too convenient or simply wrapped up. An offhand comment leads Jack to see through the cops' plans. The big confrontation plays a little quickly and the "trick" felt a bit forced to me. BUT, there's so much else going on that I got over the sticky bits, and this really was a great read.

# Good guy/bad guy By Rebekah Jonesy

This book is from the minds of both. And it is an in depth look into their thoughts and psyche. Waves of insanity, bouts of rage and depression, soul cracking tears, remorse, contempt, pity, and lust. Each man deals with his demons and pain and impulses while trying to understand the others. And the body count keeps rising. An amazingly excellent book. Keep a drink nearby because your jaw will keep dropping as you read.

# What would push you over the edge? By Michael R. Stern

WOW!! Joe Compton's "Amongst the Killing" is a must-read for crime-thriller lovers. His two main characters, a homicide detective and a serial killer, share center stage in alternating chapters. Mr. Compton portrays the thin line we all walk between our normal lives and the precarious cliffs where we might spin out of control. # by Lorraine Carey



# Cons Dames & G-Men Anthology with Adam Mitchell

This collection of short murder mysteries, all set in the 1930's and 1940's, has a grab bag of quality. A couple of the authors I've read some of their full length works and their short stories were well done. A couple of the short stories were good but needed some copy editing. There was one that I did not feel met the quality of the other stories. The following is a highlight of my favorite stories in this one.

**100 Miles to Murder by Matthew L. Schoonover** is the first in the anthology and I truly enjoyed this one. The detective work is well portrayed and doesn't reveal the murderer or how it was done too early in the story. This story is the first of this author's work I've read and will be sure to seek other works by this author.

**Cue Murder by Jane Risdon** was a little more difficult for me to get into. I think that is because the setting is in the movie industry and I have this mental block about

Hollywood and actors. But once I picked up the book again and read this story in earnest, then I felt it was worth my time to read and I was entertained even though the I found part of it to be rather cliche, but isn't that what noir murder mysteries are all about?

**Dark At The Top Of The Stairs by Elizabeth Horton-Newton** was another story I enjoyed. I've read this author before and do like her writing. I like the way she develops her characters and even in this short she was able to develop characters with some depth in very few words.

The Mickey by Neil Douglas Newton was a little different story. Instead of detective work the story centers on a witness to a murder during the depression era. The end is a bit weak but it does wrap up the story neatly, if a bit hurried.

Well I Die Tomorrow and I Can't Wait by Adam C. Mitchell was another rather different story not so much about a murder and definitely not about any detective work. However, murder is involved. You'll just have to read it to find out how.

Overall I would recommend this anthology to people who like noir murder mysteries especially if they need something to take with them to read while riding public transportation or waiting in the doctor's office. There is a good sampling of authors and if you haven't read other works of theirs you will have pretty good grasp of their writing style and quality. This anthology is currently free on Kindle from Amazon. Definitely worth getting and finding out if you'd like to read more by any of the featured authors.

I didn't know what to say, I was stunned. "Wh-where from?" I asked facing him searching his eyes, as I heard words that didn't make sense.






"C-Line?" Isidor's face went white and she felt the shudders creeping down her spine. "The Deep?"




# Wanda Pyle - Indie Author

# Tell us about yourself.

I am the grandmother of 10 grandchildren and 5 great grandchildren. I grew up on a farm in the Flint Hills of Kansas and was a frequent writer of stories as a child. I always thought that one day I would grow up to become a writer. Unfortunately, life had a way of intervening in best of my plans.

I received my Bachelor's Degree from Kansas State Teacher's College in Emporia, Kansas as did my mother and grandmother before me. I earned a Master's Degree in Education from Wichita State University and a Doctorate in Education from Azusa Pacific University in Azusa, California.





At the time, it seemed a natural course for me to take at a time when few careers were open to women. A career as a teacher and administrator coincided nicely with marriage and children and allowed me the flexibility to be home when they were little while still pursuing my love of literature. Now that my children are grown, I am still involved part-time as an administrator at the community college level which allows me more time to write.

I live in Claremont, California with my husband and spend my leisure time writing, traveling and volunteering my time in support of at-risk children. I author two blogs: one entitled "School Marms and Cowboys" at <a href="http://drwandapyle.blogspot.com">http://drwandapyle.blogspot.com</a> where I record the personal reflections and insights gleaned through my writing, and another entitled "The Write Stuff" at <a href="https://wandadehavenpyle.wordpress.com/">https://wandadehavenpyle.wordpress.com/</a> which supports the work of indie authors.

# What bought you to the world of writing?

My mother liked to write and encouraged my efforts. As a child, I read everything I could get my hands on. I always had an active imagination and a love for the written word. I still feel compelled to tell the stories in my head. They are often based on personal experiences or encounters that spark a story. My may catch a glance of someone in a park and that will set me off in an imaginary direction as I invent a story to go with the person or situation. At that point, I feel I must write it all down.

# What is your first book and what do you think of it now?


My first book was Windborne and I'm very proud of it. It was selected as a Historical Fiction Finalist in the 2016 Bookvana Awards. The book is memoir-like work of fiction set against a historical backdrop of major economic and cultural changes of the past century, that chronicles the lives of three generations through triumph and tragedy.

# What type of books do you write and do they fulfil your reader's needs?

It is difficult to categorize my work into just one genre. I am somewhere between Literary Fiction and Historical Fiction/Family Saga. I am currently at work on the final book in my legacy trilogy which follows one family through three decades during the 60s, 70s and 80s. Although there is certainly a historical backdrop, the stories lean more closely toward literary fiction. I hope they fulfil the needs of my readers. The reviews have been exceptionally good. Most readers comment that they are able to identify with the characters and situations portrayed in my work.

#### Would you like to feature a book, if so which one? Tell us about it?

The Stone House Legacy is the first book in my Legacy trilogy. When I was growing up on the farm, we lived in an old stone house that most people thought was haunted. In fact, it was the lone remaining structure from a lost settlement that was pioneered in the mid-1800s. There were the remains of an old cemetery behind the house. The tombstones were broken and abandoned, but the carvings indicated that those buried there were all infants and toddlers. Further research indicated that a sickness had overtaken the settlement and the youngest among them were the first to succumb. Since there were so many parallels between incidents the 1860s and the 1960s, I used the story of the old stone house to provide a context for the story.



When Reverend Simon Kingsley returns from Vatican II in Rome as a Protestant observer, he is filled with radical new ideas concerning long-held religious beliefs. He envisions a new order of religious and cultural tolerance that he believes is paramount to world peace and understanding. Unfortunately, there are forces working against him who see this as a threat to their way of life and a direct link to communist thought. The Stone House Legacy reveals mankind's stubborn inclination to repeat the mistakes of past generations.

# How long does it take you to write your first draft?

I try to make my novels as historically accurate as possible. I want any reader who may have experienced the places and events I write about to find them authentic. Therefore, I spend a lot of time researching and talking to people who have experienced what I am writing about. It usually takes me about a year to get the first draft ready for my first edit.

# Do you plot or not, if so why

I start with a plot outline and then write character sketches to get a feel for the main characters. I find that it gives me the structure I need to move forward. I believe that both plot and characterization are necessary to make a story believable and authentic. Without this structure in place in the beginning, I tend to lose track of the plot or else I wind up with 2-dimensional characters that are more like caricatures than characters. That being said, I seldom follow the outline that closely. As the story unfolds, both the plot and the characters begin to take on a life of their own in spite of my best efforts to control them.

# Do you write in 1st or 3rd person, or have you do both?

So far, I have written in 3rd person. However, I am experimenting with a 3rd person limited point of view in the last book in the trilogy. This still allows the reader to see the action from abroad perspective while only getting inside the head of one character.

# How do you edit your work? Do you leave your draft alone for a while or edit as you write?

Both. I often hit a crossroad in my writing that necessitates going back to remind myself of what motivated the character to get to a certain point. This also helps me to keep the plot focused and moving. Sometimes I have to rewrite a passage to provide better motivation for the action later on. However, the real editing takes place at the end.

# What type of people/readers do you market your books to?

Most of my work features strong female characters who grow and overcome hardships. So, I guess my primary audience would be women who have some life experience behind them. However, I have received positive comments from male readers who enjoy the suspense and mystery included in the plot.

# Do you self-publish or have you worked with an Agent/Published?

At this point, I am strictly self-published. I don't rule out working with an agent or publisher, but I am not ready to take that on just yet.

# How do you promote your writing?

I promote mostly through social media. However, I have also done launch parties, book signings, book talks, and readings. I am currently available in several libraries and independent bookstores in Southern California.

Creating Your Author Brand
Whether you have 15 books published, 2 books published, or you haven't even published your first book, you need to take
steps to establish your brand as an author. When people want to learn more about you, you want to make sure that there
are no barriers to this process. Some people will want to read your author profile on Amazon, while others will want to
check out your website. You want to make sure all bases are covered. Luckily, you may have already done some of these
things, so make a nice checkmark right next to them if they are already completed.
☐ <b>Create your website</b> – Having a website is very important. If you don't know anything about domains, hosting, etc.,
you can create a free blog at Blogger.com or Wordpress.com. The key is to get a website as a central hub for the rest of your
internet presence.
☐ <b>Add all books to your website</b> – There should be a page dedicated to each of your books on your website. These
pages should include a cover, a description, a price, and links directly to the booksellers. Don't forget to use your Amazon
associates affiliate link to earn a little more money from each sale!

# MAKING TIME TO WRITE: REFLECTIONS OF A NEW AUTHOR

"You have a real gift for writing and if you are going to be a successful author, you need to take it seriously and make time for it."

This bit of wisdom was shared with me by a New York Times best-selling author at a writer's conference I attended this past year. She reviewed a section of my first book Reaching for the Light: An Incest Survivor's Story. I was both honored and a bit star struck that an author of her caliber is willing to review my work.

Putting her advice into practice has proved much easier said than done.

Writing is a favorite hobby of mine, something to do here and there whenever I have some down time. Before Reaching for the Light became a reality, the idea of being a published author was a "maybe someday" pipe dream. Between working a full-time job, being a full-time college student, and going to therapy every week I had no time for any writing that wasn't part of my college program. After I graduated, finding time to write took a back seat to working along with the other myriad details of daily living that fill our days.

It was my therapist Tee who, in 1996, suggested I write a book about my recovery journey as an incest survivor. "You have a powerful story that needs to be told"

Over the next year, I'd scribble down a few thoughts here and there whenever I could find a spare minute to write. I quickly discovered I was not yet healed enough to write about what had happened to me starting when I was just 8 years old. The few pages I had written were put in a box where they remained for the next 20 years.

In the winter of 2011, I celebrated my 50th birthday. About this time, my husband David and I decided we needed to clear out the clutter in our small house. In between our full-time jobs and other responsibilities, we gradually sorted through old boxes and other miscellaneous items. One Saturday morning as I opened yet another box, I found those long forgotten first pages of what would become Reaching for the Light.

As I read the words I had written two decades before, I knew the time had come to write my story. I had lived a half-century of my life and I knew without absolute certainty that if I didn't write my story now, I never would. Beyond the emotional challenge of writing such a personal and painful story, finding the time to write proved to be no small challenge in itself.

At this point in time, I was a full time social worker working with the mentally ill. It's a high stress, exhausting job and most days I came home with no energy or enthusiasm for anything more than vegetating in front of the television before going to bed. And yet it was as if there was some indescribable spirit spurring me to write my story. Overworked and stressed out, I had no time for pipe dreams of becoming a published author so I pushed the feeling away. Besides, I told myself, what are the chances that anyone will want to read it anyway.

For the next 3 years, I sketched out ideas, thoughts, memories as they came to me whenever I had a few minutes here and there. The book was still just a hobby and not something I really thought seriously about.

And then a remarkable thing happened.

I've been a chronic insomniac all my life. It's a left over from my childhood when sleeping was often dangerous. The internet is an insomniac's dream. There is always somebody awake somewhere in the world. One night I was chatting online with a lady who mentioned she was an independent publisher. This intrigued me and I told I liked to write though I don't really have much time for it. She asked me to send her a sample of my writing. This brief exchange changed my life for all time.

My "someday" pipe dream now became very real. And finding time to write now became a necessity. Insomnia became my friend as it allowed me to spend a few hours at night writing after David had gone to sleep. On the downside, sleep deprivation was my constant companion. I was constantly exhausted. David works a high stress job as well in addition to being a musician. Many times, we were like two ships that passed out in the night.

Something had to give. I received rave reviews from my publisher and a few trusted individuals who were my beta readers. And while this boosted my confidence and motivation to keep writing, finding time to write continued to be problematic. If I was going to pursue writing and actually have my book published, I could not continue working around the clock.

The functionality and underlying dynamics of the agency I worked for had always been a bit questionable through the years I had been there. By late 2015, it became unbearable. After talking it over with David, I resigned my position. With David's support, I spent the next several months finishing the book and handing it off to the publisher. It debuted in July, 2016. I am proud to say it has earned 5 stars from the day it was released.

I've learned a lot in the process of writing Reaching for the Light. The author who spoke to me at the conference is indeed right. I must take my writing seriously. God has given me this gift and I must give it the time and attention it requires for me to continue to grow as a writer. This means I must schedule time for it in my daily life. It's an ongoing struggle I am determined to win.

# **Running for the Rock Star**


She's a good-girl control freak. He's a bad boy in need of a clean image. Will these opposites attract or self-destruct?

Whether it be paper and a pen or taking over the kid's Minecraft, I love to create and have come up with some incredible pieces.

# How did you get into graphic design?

I have always had this insane need to create. It started with my stories, writing them down as they floated through my head, telling myself I'd edit them later as I doodled about the pages. Well, later arrived, and I needed covers for them all. Who knew, with stylus in hand, one could create such wonders?

# When did you start?

My madness started as a child, my love for art appeared around the same time; but I just recently started playing and creating online.

# What inspires you?

People! They have crazy ideas! I work with ideas and create something with them! It's a win win so long as everyone's having fun.

Totally not the clients fault, I just hate the waiting game!

# What's your favourite tool? Paintbrush stylus pencil marker?

All of them! If it creates, it's gold! But if I had to choose just one, it would be my stylus, for with it I can use all sorts of tools!

# Do you prefer black and white Gray slake or colour bomb?

I've played with both, though I always find that color bomb really catches they eye. The world is sort of darker these days, so I tend to brighten it up a bit with my work.

# Do you stay with one canvas or have you tried others? For example, some use paper to paint and draw. Some use cloth and paint fabric and others prefer digital?

I use whatever is available! If I'm home, I use my laptop and stylus, if I'm out waiting for the kids to finish whatever they're doing, I'll use my phone or grab and play with Picsart, or find a pen a start doodling on whatever I can find. We could be sitting in a restaurant and I'll grab the kids crayons and color a napkin for one of them, some tropical scene to occupy them while we wait for our food. If it's there, I'll use it, and being able to share and help others with their own creations is a total bonus.


# Good solid ghost story Review By Phil Leader




# Chant of a Million Women by Shirani Rajapakse

# Nigel Day - Indie Author



# Tell us about yourself.

I am New Zealand born and bred and have never really considered living anywhere else. Other places are nice to visit but I figure we have it pretty good down this side of the world.

I have been writing on and off for a number of years but only recently got serious about it. The ideas have always been there they just needed a matching amount of commitment and drive to see them through to publishing a complete story.

# What bought you to the world of writing?

I read a lot as a kid. It seemed like a natural progression to go from that to writing the kinds of stories I was reading.

# What is your first book and what do you think of it now?

Cosmic Gift is my first published story. I have written others though I have not tried publishing them.

# What type of books do you write and do they fulfil your reader's needs?

I mostly write in the fantasy genre as that is where most of my ideas come from. Cosmic Gift could be considered urban fantasy as it is set in the real world. I hope anyone who reads it will like it but in the end that is something only they can decide.

# Would you like to feature a book, if so which one? Tell us about it?

Cosmic Gift is the first in the Tales of the Magician series and is about a young man; Michael Whelan who is suddenly bestowed with superpowers and his attempts to deal with that and make a life for himself on his own terms.

# How long does it take you to write your first draft?

The length of time it takes to write my first draft depends on two things. Firstly, the length of the story for obvious reasons and secondly it depends on what else is going on in my life at the time. This one took me roughly 3 months to do the first draft and a lot longer to do the editing.

#### Do you plot or not, if so why?

I don't plot in the formal sense of creating a chapter outline before I start writing the story. I know a lot of writers like to work that way but I'm a little more organic. I have a rough outline of the story in my head as well as a series of scenes. I then write to link all that up. I have tried to write out outlines before I get going but find I am always impatient to begin the story. In the end I believe that writing is a process that is individual to each writer. It is just a matter of finding out what works best for you.

# Do you write in 1st or 3rd person, or have you done both?

I had always worked in 3rd person before I began writing Cosmic Gift. Up until that point I wasn't certain I could find the right voice for a 1st person adventure. I think it has worked well enough to keep going and I will probably work in both styles from now on.

# How do you edit your work? Do you leave your draft alone for a while or edit as you write?

I hand write my first drafts and I don't edit as I write. I am too eager to get the ideas out and find a bit of distance between writing and editing helps as it gives me some time to let those ideas turn over in my mind so I can decide whether they work or not.

#### What type of people/readers do you market your books to?

I'd like to think that anybody who reads fantasy books would be willing to give mine a go and really anybody who just wants an entertaining read. I write as well as I can but the books aren't literature and they are not designed to be.

# Do you self-publish or have you worked with an Agent/Published?

Cosmic Gift is self-published and those that follow are likely to be as well. The whole agent, formal publishing thing looks to be more of a trial than it needs to be.

# Where can we buy your books?

Cosmic gift is currently available online from ibooks, Google Play, Kobo and Barnes and Noble.

#### Who are your favourite authors?

I read a lot of fantasy books as well as some science fiction and contemporary stuff. So for fantasy I enjoy authors like Robert Jordan, Sebastien De Castell and Jim Butcher. Robert B. Parker has written some excellent detective fiction and I have read a lot of books by older authors like Alistair McClean as well.






